Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium

The DfE has made available additional funds to schools to improve the progress of students, known as the Year 7 Catch-Up Premium. Bentley Wood High School receives Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium to improve the attainment of pupils who have achieved below 100 in reading and/or mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2.

Objective:

To improve progress and attainment of students in English and/or mathematics who have not achieved above 100 in reading and/or mathematics at Key Stage 2 and thus ensure full access to the secondary curriculum.

Toe by Toe	Individual tuition: students receiving one to one literacy support using the Toe by Toe reading/literacy scheme.

Graduate Teaching Assistants	In class support: GTAs used in classrooms to support students who have been identified as needed additional literacy support. GTAs working closely with English teachers in order to enhance curriculum for targeted students and also further progression.

Book Cub/ literacy activities	Students invited by the librarian to take part in book clubs and literacy visits to local library/meet authors
