PHOTOSHOOT


Complete a 30 image photoshoot of anything relevant to Transformation

These will be printed when you return to school.










Task 2

Comparing Artists Choose 4 artists from this PowerPoint.


Complete an A3 page of research looking briefly at all your selected artists.
